RE: Call for Arch Chapter Nomination Recommendations

I am writing to you today as the immediate past president of Delta Tau Delta at the request of Vice President Alan Brackett. As President Jim Selzer continues to convalesce from his recent illness, Vice President Brackett has been performing the day-to-day duties of the Fraternity normally handled by the president. One of those duties is to oversee the appointment of the Karnea Nominations Committee. Since Brother Brackett intends to be a candidate for national office at the 2010 Karnea, I am acting on Jim Selzer's behalf as prescribed in Article VII, Section 2 of the Bylaws.

As we prepare for the 2010 Karnea in Washington, it is time to proceed with the Fraternity's nominations and election process. Beginning in 2000 with its passage by joint Arch Chapter/Undergraduate Council action, the Fraternity adopted a set of practices and procedures for this process designed to assure Delta Tau Delta continues to attract leaders of the highest caliber through a proceeding which honors its principles.

To facilitate that effort, the Arch Chapter and Undergraduate Council created a recommendation form for elected service. A copy of the form and explanation of the process are enclosed for your use. We are asking that anyone interested in elected service, or in recommending an alumnus for service, complete and return the form to the Central Office by April 1, 2010. This will facilitate the process of recruiting alumni and enable us to provide adequate communication with Karnea delegates regarding the background and credentials of alumni interested in elected service.

These responses will be provided to former International President David Nagel, Gamma Pi (Iowa State) 1963, who has agreed to serve as chairman of the Nominations Committee for the 2010 Karnea. As chairman, Dave will be charged with the responsibility of contacting alumni who have expressed interest, or who have been recommended for service. Please note these are merely recommendations to the Karnea Nominations Committee for its consideration. They do not put the man's name into nomination for election. That action will be done from the floor during a Karnea business session.

The Nominations Committee, to be composed of three alumni and four undergraduate members, will conduct interviews at the Karnea and provide the Karnea with its recommendations for the positions of president, vice president, second vice president, treasurer, secretary and director of academic affairs. It will be the duty of the Karnea delegates to reach a decision and elect the six men who will join the seated division presidents to comprise the Arch Chapter of 2010-2012.

Thank you for your continuing support of the Fraternity. I look forward to seeing all of you in Washington, D.C. when the 2010 Karnea begins on August 4.
